## MOSES GIVES PHARAOH GOD'S MESSAGE

Scripture: Exodus 4:29-7:7

Memory Verse: I Corinthians 15:58 Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

**Materials Needed:** 

Dry erase board/markers Robes for kids to act parts

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Objectives: As a result of this lesson, I want my student

To Know:

When Moses obeyed God and took His message to the people and opposition came not only from the Egyptians, but also from the Israelites, Moses and Aaron continued to obey God in spite of the opposition.

## To Realize:

One should not give up doing the work God has given them to do when opposition and trouble come.

To Respond: by remaining steadfast to the work God has given them to do, even when it has difficulties.

## Approach:

Play a review game from last week or ask: "Last week we studied how God came to Moses with the announcement that He had seen the suffering of the Israelites and He was going to deliver them...through Moses! What did Moses think would happen (again!) if he went back to Egypt?" (write these three things on the board: the Israelites wouldn't believe; Pharaoh wouldn't let them go; the whole thing would fail.) Do you think that's what happened? (Note: they will say "no" because they know the end of the story, but the first two things actually do happen in today's lesson—so this question is setting them up!) Let's see what happened...

## Outline of Passage:

Scripture: Exodus 4:29-5:1

I. Moses Tells Israelites and Pharaoh God's Message

## **Lesson Development:**

**Note:** if you want to bring a couple of robes for the kids to dress up in the various roles:

Moses/Pharaoh/Israelites. Tell the story and leave pauses for the students to then act it out.

Read 5:22—"You have not delivered your people at all!!"
Take another poll. "At THIS POINT...has what Moses thought would happen, happened?" How many say yes? No?
(point back to three things on board

from set up that Moses thought would happen)

Did the Israelites listen? No Did Pharaoh let them go? No Did the whole thing fail? No Was it easy? No.

Did Moses quit? No!! Why not? (because God was still working His plan out.)

#### Conclusion:

Have you ever felt like quitting doing the right thing because it was hard? What would Moses tell you to do today? Why? Let's pray.

#### Homework Ideas:
