DAVID RECEIVES THE KINGDOM

Scripture:

I Samuel 31:1-13, II Samuel 1:1-2:11, 5:1-11, Philippians 2:8-11 Pictures of story—Life of David series 1: DC 1.6 and DC 1.3

Materials Needed:

Pictures of story—Life of David series 1 DC 1.6 and DC 1.3 Life of David series 2: DD 1.2, 1.3, 4.1, 4.2, 4.4, Life of David series 3: DE 1.6, 1.1, 1.2. 6.3 and 6.4

Memory Verse:

I Peter 5:6 Humble yourselves, therefore under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time.

Objectives: As a result of this lesson, I want my students

To Know—Although Saul was tall and strong in battle and many followed him and got nice things, and David was a humble shepherd who had to hide in caves while he was persecuted, in the end Saul's life ended in disgrace and David was honored as God's choice of King by the whole nation—even receiving an eternal kingdom.

To Realize—Although those who turn from God may seem to have great power and benefits for those who follow them, they will end in disgrace, but God's humble and anointed King, even though rejected and persecuted for a time, will receive great honor with all bowing to Him.

To Respond by—following King Jesus at any cost because He will receive His kingdom.

Setting up the Story:

We have been studying about King Saul and God's Anointed King David. Next week we are going to move to a new unit, but I told you last time that we were going to see what happened to Saul after David spared his life—and that is what we are going to do today.

Today we are going to play a PRETEND game! We are going to pretend that we are going to join the army back at this time of the Bible story. And we don't know whether we should join Saul and his army, or join David. Now---you've already heard some of the story, so you know that David is the good one in the story...but there were LOTS of people who joined King Saul. So I want <u>us to try to figure out why someone would</u> want to join Saul and not join David.

We are going to start at the Very Beginning, when Saul was chosen as the FIRST King! What did people like about Saul?

II. In the Middle

- A. Saul seems to have all the power
 - 1. He has a crown
 - 2. He gives gifts to loyal followers (I Sam. 22:7)
 - 3. 3,000 soldiers to do what he wants
 - 4. He tries to kill David 10x! (Lots of people help him!)

B. David suffers

- 1. Has to run away
- 2. Lives in caves
- 3. Only 600 men follow him (outcasts)

III. At the End...

- A. Saul's life ends in disgrace.
 - 1. Saul consults a witch: on his own!

When the Philistines realized that King Saul was dead, what do you think they did? They rejoiced and thought their idols had helped them.

The Philistine weren't the only ones who heard that Saul was dead!

The news reaches David and the men who were loval to him! How do you think David felt when he heard that Saul and his sons were DEAD?!

(Show Card DE 1.6)

NOW...finally David can be king! He ASKS GOD what to do! (Show Card DE 1.1)

(Show Card DE 1.2)

David has waited and waited... And then the day came when ALL the leaders of ALL the rest of the tribes came to David. They knew all along that God had put him as the king over them...and now they acknowledge him and anoint him!

Concluding the Story:

(Show visual DE 6.3)

...JESUS!

After David had reigned as king, his son was anointed king.

And then David's grandson, and great-grandson, and great-great-great-great...grandson! And that great-great-great-great-great...grandson was also born in Bethlehem, just like David was. And you know his Name!! (let students see if they can guess, then write on the board:)

Jesus is from David's kingly line and is God's chosen King to rule over, not just Israel like David did, but over the WHOLE WORLD. (Show card DE 6.4) There are people today who are big and important—and they don't love God—just like Saul did not love God but went his own way. LOTS of people follow them. Sometimes when people follow Jesus, others make fun of them and it's hard. But guess what? God has promised that one day EVERY KNEE will bow and EVERY TONGUE will say that JESUS is LORD! ...just like all the tribes realized David was the right king.

It is WORTH IT to follow Jesus now, even when it is hard.
